Flower Regulations

These regulations take into account our customer's desire to place displays on graves with safety and the time required to maintain the beautiful grounds of Mountain View Cemetery.

Permitted Displays

Fresh cut flowers placed on headstones or in pre-set vases are allowed year round provided the flowers are not in wrapping or external vases or containers.

Prohibited Displays

- Glass, plastic, metal, ceramic (breakable) vases or containers of any kind on or around headstones.
- Flowers with wire stems or petals.
- Flags, candles, lights, balloons, beverages, toys, pinwheels, etc. outside headstone perimeter.

Size

Temporary displays must be small enough to sit entirely on the headstone or concrete border. Permanent flower displays are not permitted on flat headstones. Display placement must not interfere with mowing or trimming.

Upkeep

Our staff members have the right to discard displays that are unsightly, neglected or broken. These items can become dangerous projectiles if mower blade or string trimmers throw them. Staff members will not salvage or store any displays they removed.

Funerals

Flowers may be left on the gravesite for 5 days following a service.

Holidays

Items may be displayed **ON** headstones or in pre-set vases in the headstones foundation for a 9-day period beginning the Saturday prior to the holiday



The Cemetery is open to the public year round, from dusk to dawn.

Winter Displays

Displays may remain continuously from the third Saturday in November through the first Sunday in March.
